

GCARS 2 METER PACEMAKER NET PREAMBLE

CQ, CQ, CQ, this is (your call sign) now opening the Gaston County Amateur Radio Society Pacemaker Net and ARES Emergency Net. This net is sponsored by the Gaston County Amateur Radio Society and we are using the N4GAS repeater located on Spencer Mountain near Gastonia. This is a mixed net beginning with a formal session for handling ARES traffic and followed by the informal portion. The net meets each Tuesday at 9:00 p.m. for the purpose of gathering all licensed amateur radio operators to handle ARES traffic, for fellowship, rag chew, and to promote the amateur radio hobby. My name is (your name and call sign) and I am located in (your city).

Net control will now stand by for any station that has any announcements or other traffic for the net, please call (your call sign). (Emergency traffic should be handled immediately.)

We will now begin taking check-ins alphabetically. Stations checking in are asked to give their call sign, name, and location.
